Teacher Materials:

- Class copies of exit slips
- Word cards

Pre-assessment

What does the suffix "-less" mean?

Journal-have students read a list of words and think about what -less must mean

Introduce with a description

Students share journals with partners and then whole group; discuss as a class the definition of the suffix -less.

Teacher leads class in shared reading of list of example words.

Restate

Teacher models how to break words-root word and suffix and how the suffix affects the meaning of the root word.

Picture

Have students draw a picture that reflects the meaning of the affix.

Activities

Discussion:

Lead students in using Example Words with –less.

Discuss the following sentence:

It wasn't just the mistake he made, it was his care<u>less</u> attitude that made his Dad mad.
